In the absence of an extraordinary increase in facility funding from Congress, which does not appear to be on the horizon, DoD must turn to a variety of innovative mechanisms to increase efficiency and reduce cost to maintain installation readiness. We propose that DoD consider a new innovation: a market-driven approach to improve installation readiness; an approach that could create the right incentives for cost-effective facilities for mission support."
